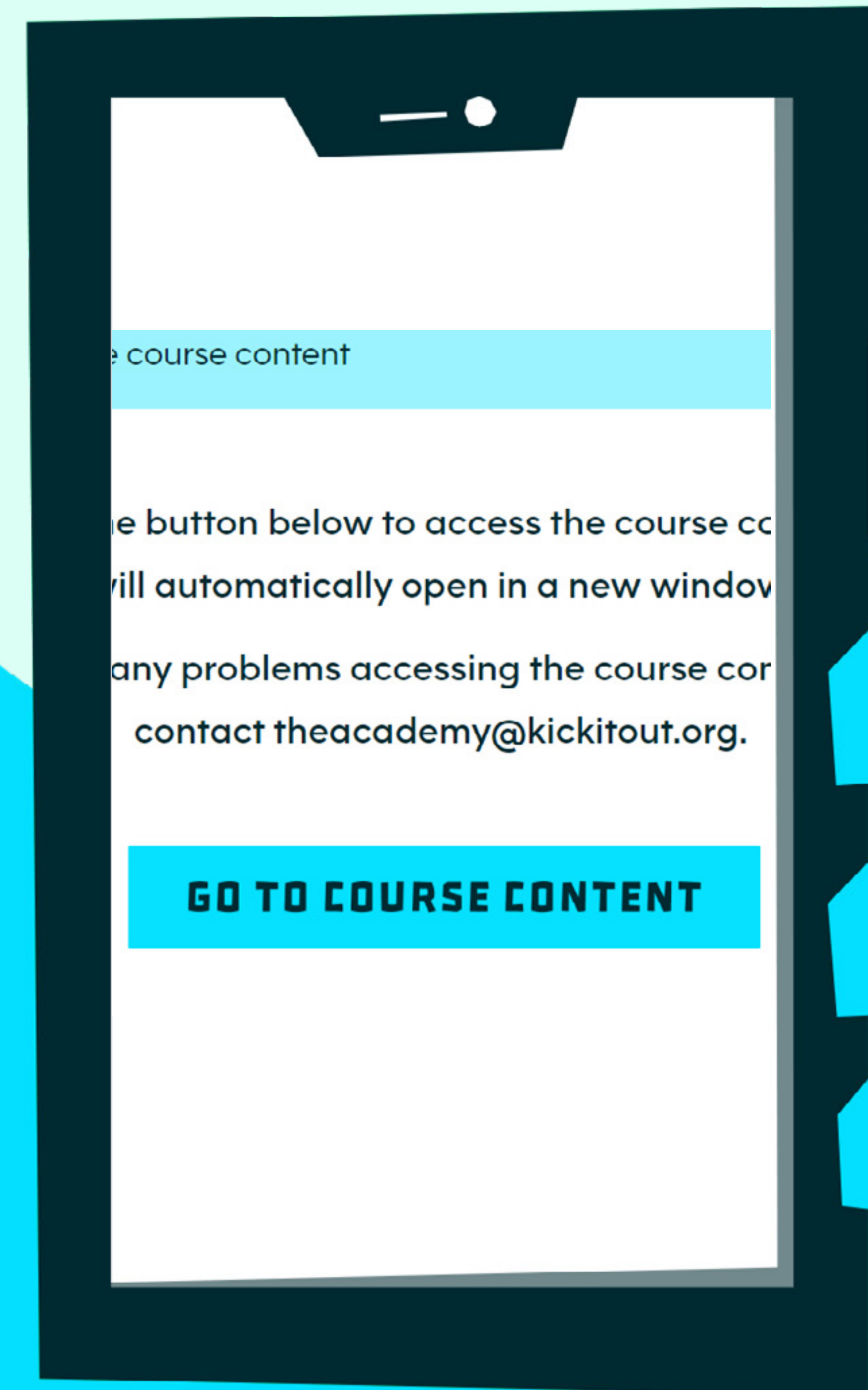
ACCESSING THE CONTENT

Once you have selected the 'GO TO COURSE CONTENT' button on the course page, the course content will automatically open in a new window (please ensure any pop-up blockers are disabled).

The course content runs in a browser window and should adapt to most devices, however we recommend using either a laptop, desktop or tablet.

STARTING THE COURSE

When first accessing the course, you have the option to jump straight into the content by selecting the 'Start Course' button below the title.

Alternatively, you can browse each of the topic titles and select where you would like to start.

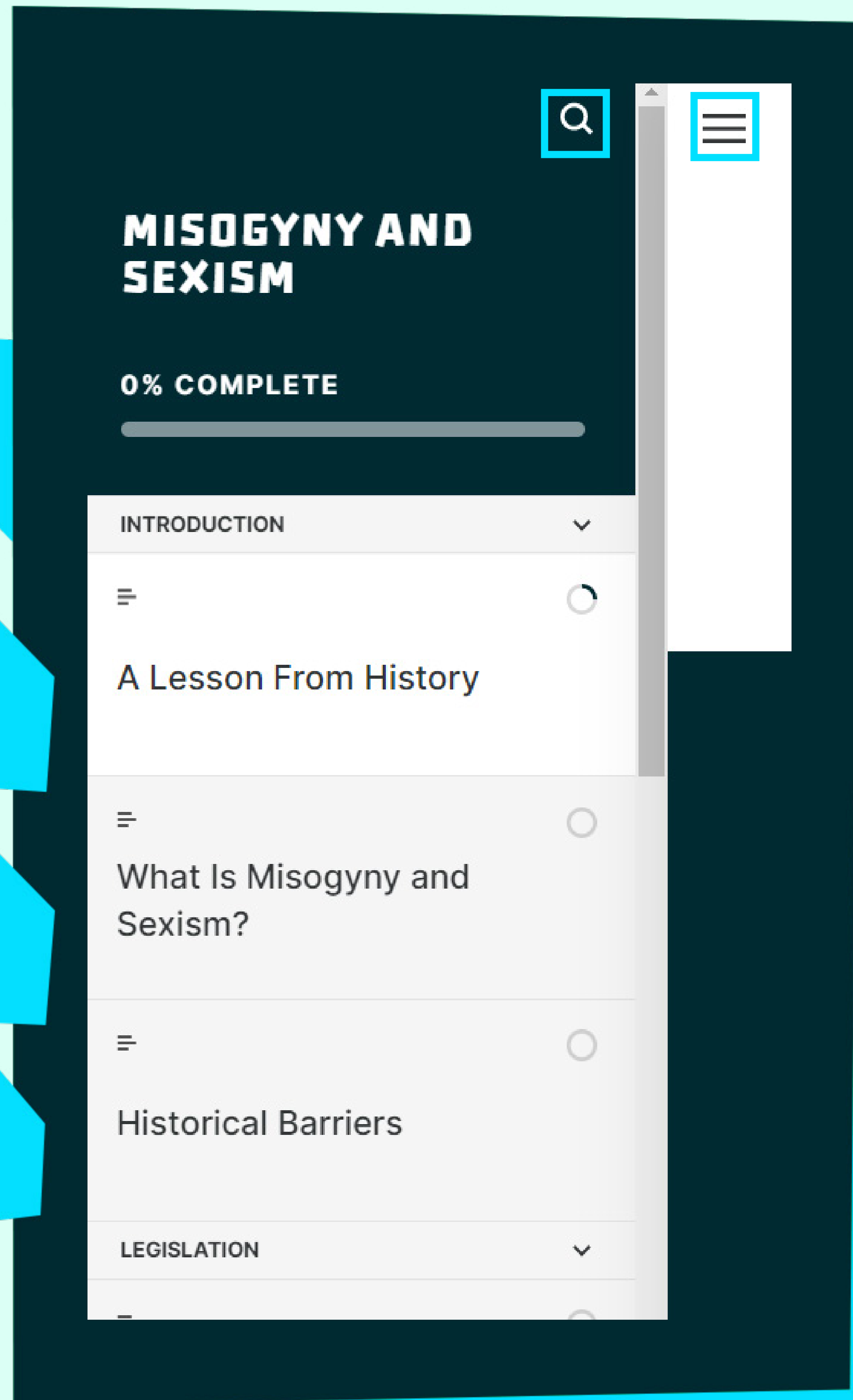

NAVIGATION AND SEARCHING



Once you start the course, you will automatically be presented with the first page. You can navigate through the course in a linear fashion by scrolling through each page and selecting the 'CONTINUE' button to move on to the next page.

Alternatively, you can navigate to a specific page by selecting the sandwich menu (a set of triple underlines) located in the top-left corner. Selecting this will either hide or unhide the side menu. You can then select the page you would like to open.

The magnifying glass at the top of the side menu will allow you to search the content of the course for specific key terms.
